

## KAPANY CHAIR IN GLOBAL AND SIKH STUDIES AT UCSB

The Global Studies Department at the University of California, Santa Barbara, invites applications and nominations for the endowed Kundan Kaur Kapany Chair in Global and Sikh Studies, beginning in academic year 2018-19. The department seeks a distinguished professor with an international scholarly reputation for a tenured, full-professor appointment to be housed in global studies and possibly jointly in another department appropriate to the chair-holder's expertise. Applicants must have an exemplary record of research and teaching in fields related to the study of Sikhism in its global context, including the historical development of the tradition and its contemporary social and cultural variations around the world. The Department of Global Studies offers B.A., M.A., and Ph.D. degrees in the field, and focuses on the transnational, interdisciplinary and critical study of globalization in its social, cultural, political, economic, and other dimensions. Applicants must possess a Ph.D. or similar degree, a commitment to the fields of global and Sikh studies, and an understanding of the Sikh community.
